

From your pastor ...

This past Friday was truly an extraordinary day for the Diocese of La Crosse with the celebration of the Eucharistic Revival that was expressed in the pilgrimage that came from the Diocese of Winona (which had begun in the Archdiocese of Minneapolis-St. Paul.) into the Diocese of La Crosse. There were approximately 1500 people involved in the procession that came across the Camoran Street bridge. I was in the procession and found it to be spiritually moving. There were eucharistic hymns sung along the way as well as small altars set up where the procession would stop and the monstrance displaying our Lord would rest for a moment surrounded with prayer and then raised in blessing over the faithful in procession. When the pilgrimage finally crossed the Mississippi River and arrived in the City of La Crosse, the monstrance was transferred to Bishop Battersby (our new Bishop of La Crosse). Bishop Battersby then led the procession into the La Crosse Center where many more Catholic were assembled waiting for our Eucharistic Lord to arrive. It was estimated that over 4,000 were present for the Mass, led by Bishop Battersby and preached by Bishop Barron. It was truly a most wonderful event.

Our parish experience of celebrating this Eucharistic Revival happening throughout the United States will happen in a particular way with the installation of our communion rail in the sanctuary. I do not have a definitive date as to when the communion rail will arrive and be installed. I suspect that it is at least a month away.

I shared some time ago that the marble being used in the construction of the communion rail is from the same quarry in Italy (the Carrara region) as is the marble that was used in the construction of our ambo (lectern from where the Sacred Scriptures are read). This is from the same region that was quarried centuries ago for the marble used by Michelangelo in his sculptures. This marble was also used in numerous churches in Rome and used to build the Pantheon (now the church of All Saints) as well as Saint Peter's Basilica.

This weekend I have asked Monsignor Robert Hundt to take my place at the weekend Masses so that I could attend the 50th (51st year) anniversary of Saint Francis DeSales High School Seminary in Milwaukee where I graduated in 1973. We had 44 graduate and 31 of us have signed up to be in attendance at the Mater Christi (Mother of Christ) Chapel for the Mass at the DeSales complex. (It is no longer a seminary, but a diocesan center now used for various offices and ministries.) Of the 44 graduates only three of us continued to ordination. Father Paul Rogers has died, and Father Howard Haase is undergoing cancer therapy, so that leaves me to celebrate the Mass, (an outlier from the La Crosse Diocese). There will be two classmates in the sanctuary with me who are permanent deacons from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. After the Mass, we are driving across the city to a restaurant for dinner and a program.

I initially planned to drive back yet Saturday night to be here for the Sunday morning Masses, but after further thought and Monsignor Hundt's willingness to celebrate the Sunday Masses, I will be staying in Milwaukee with some of my classmates and enjoy a brunch with some of them later Sunday morning. I hope you enjoy a different "voice" with Monsignor Hundt as the celebrant.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
