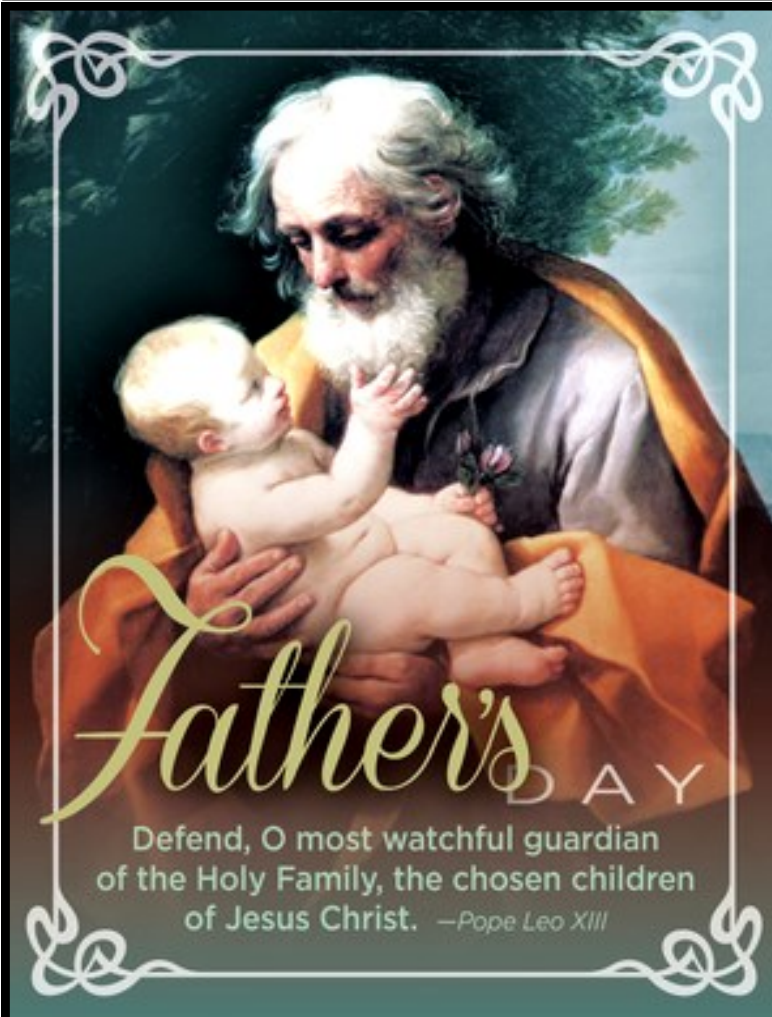

Spiritual Communion

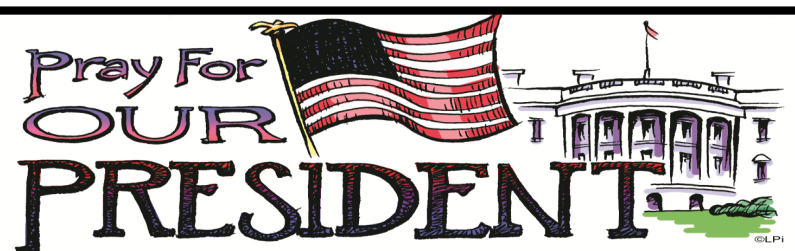
My Jesus, I believe that Thou art truly present in the Most

From your pastor . . .

I take this occasion to extend a blessed Father's Day to all Fathers in our parish. Thank you for the care that you give to your family throughout the year and for the many sacrifices you make in living out your vocation as a Father.

Beginning May 1, this year was declared by Bishop Callahan to be dedicated to Saint Joseph, the patron saint of our Diocese. Saint Joseph is also the patron saint of Fathers. At the end of this column I will include a prayer that I pray to Saint Joseph and perhaps you may wish to pray it as well.

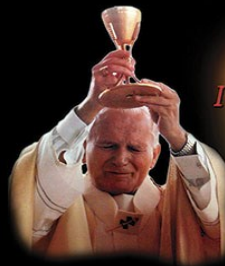

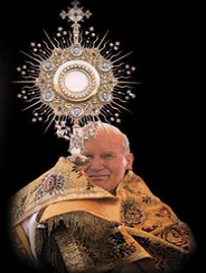

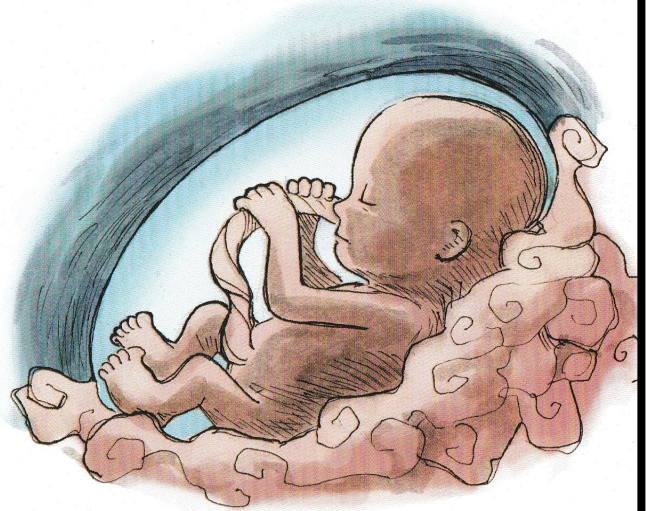
