From your pastor . . .

I will take a break from reproducing Father John A. Hardon's Catechism on the Eucharist to write to you about two matters that took place this past week in La Crosse.

One that I already wrote about was the ordination of four young men, Jared Clements, Alex Kren, Isaac Pecha and John Zweber this past Saturday at Saint Joseph the Workman Cathedral in La Crosse with Bishop William Callahan at the principal celebrant. The Cathedral holds @800 people and it was filled with some people having to stand. There were @80 priests in attendance and many deacons. It was an impressive celebration of the Catholic community. I am sometimes asked if I have witnessed a return of the many Catholics who were told to refrain from coming to Mass during COVID-19. While it has not been a 100% return, the ordination Mass was a wonderful expression of the vitality of the Catholic Church in the Diocese of La Crosse. Please remember to pray for these four young men as they begin the service to God's people.

The second matter I wish to include in this column, transpired during the Priest Unity Days which took place on Thursday and Friday of last week at the La Crosse Diocesan Center. There are numerous presentations that are given to the priests of the Diocese during this annual gathering. One such presentation concerned the **Inspired by the Spirit** capital campaign which has now concluded in the Diocese of La Crosse. Just as our parish was a participant in the campaign, so too were all the parishes in the Diocese. You may recall that the overall goal was \$40 million. It was announced that a little over \$48 million was raised in the Diocese through cash and pledges, making it a success that should materially sustain the parishes of as well as the Diocesan offices for many years to come.

During the presentation on the campaign, a poster was circulated to all the pastors to take back to their parishes for display. The poster included a message of "thanks" from Bishop Callahan (which I will produce below) and a photo of a renovation project that the campaign was responsible for financing. That photo, which is now circulating throughout the Diocese is of our parish church here at Saint Mary's. While they were only giving out one poster to each parish, I begged for a few extra and they are now displayed at the various entrances and exits of our church. Be certain to take a moment to look at the poster. It is a nice honor for the work that we accomplished to be displayed in this way.

Bishop Callahan's message that also appears on the poster states the following:

THANK YOU!

Thank you, dear brother priests. Thank you, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ. Thank you to everyone throughout the Diocese, who together raised more than \$40 million, safeguarding the future of our beloved Diocese. This campaign would not have come this far without your shared hard work and sacrifices. I am humbled by your efforts and inspired by your success. These seeds you planted will bear fruit beyond our time together.

Please join me in praying for the good, realized together, that is before us.
