From your pastor . . .

As I mentioned in my last column, the priests of the Diocese met from June 22-24 in La Crosse for the annual Priest Unity Days, (PUD). It provides a time for us priests to gather with our diocesan bishop to consider various matters that pertain to our priestly ministry in the Diocese of La Crosse.

One of the matters that was discussed was the bishop's gratitude to the priests and the lay faithful in carrying out a successful capital campaign under the title, "**Inspired by the Spirit.**" The campaign that had as its target \$40 million has concluded after receiving gifts and pledges of over \$48 million. Last week, I reproduced the bishop's message of thanks that appears on the poster that has been posted near the exits/entrances to our church. When you look closely at this poster, you will see that it is our parish church of Saint Mary's Parish that is featured.

Another matter that was discussed during PUD was the Eucharistic Revival that is being orchestrated in every diocese and parish throughout the United States. If you read this column regularly, you will have noticed that much of what I have been including has to do with our faith as Catholics in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. This will continue in the weeks and months to come.

One of the recommended activities that can take place in parishes is the hosting of the "Eucharist Miracles Exhibit. This exhibit has been scheduled for our parish with the set up beginning on October 18th and finally concluding on Sunday, October 22nd. This exhibit was constructed by an Italian teenager by the name of Carlo Acutis who contracted leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15. His life was such an example for others that the cause for his canonization has been taken up and he is now Blessed Carlo Acutis. The exhibition will present a selection of the main Eucharistic miracles which occurred over the centuries in various countries that are recognized by the Church. There are 158 miracles collected, each on a 2' x3' laminated panel. Through these panels you will be able to "virtually visit" the places where the miracles happened. While it is a few months in the future, we should look forward to the arrival of this extraordinary exhibition.

One other recommendation that has been made to parishes is providing good reading material for parishioners concerning the Holy Eucharist. To this end, the paperback book entitled This is my Body, by Bishop Robert Barron, of the Winona, Mn. Diocese is being made available to all parishioners beginning this weekend. Please pick up a copy and take it home with you. The book is designed to accompany the Eucharistic Revival. Bishop Barron analyzes the source and summit of the Christian life according to the categories of meal, sacrifice, and Real Presence. His prayer and hope are that it might help the reader understand the Sacrament of Jesus' Body and Blood more thoroughly, so that you will come to love the Lord more completely. The book is somewhat academic, but it can produce good spiritual fruit in your life. Take one home and give it a try.

You can be assured that more will be coming through this column and into our parish concerning the Eucharistic Revival. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.

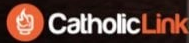
