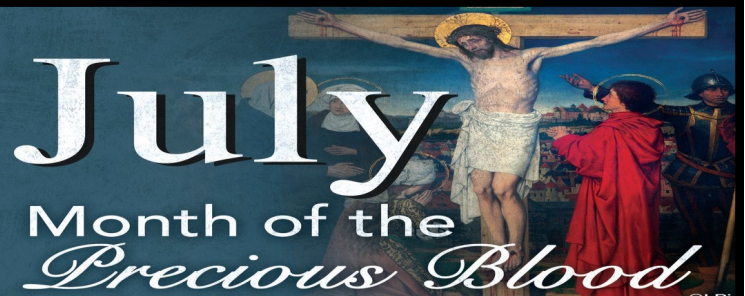

From your pastor . . .

I have been using the last few columns to introduce the **Inspired by the Spirit** capital campaign that is diocesan-wide and will be coming to our parish beginning in August and concluding in November (before Thanksgiving).

What I write in these columns will sometimes be redundant in that I will repeat certain matters that pertain to the campaign. This may be tedious for you who read this column every week, however I assume that is not the case with all parishioners, who read it occasionally. Repeating certain points is an attempt to reach those who do not read this column each week. Because this campaign is going to be reaching out to every parishioner, it is my intention through these columns to explain as much as possible so that it is not a surprise or a shock when it brought to everyone's attention with a request for a contribution/5-year pledge.

The Lynch Development Associated, Inc (LDA) firm was hired by the bishop to conduct the campaign after they did a feasibility study throughout the diocese in 2021 which gave a positive endorsement for a diocesan-wide campaign. Having received the policies and procedures from Lynch, it is evident that they run a methodical and meticulous campaign. They require that much of the initial work be done by the pastor, first in locating parishioners to volunteer in serving in various leadership positions and then meeting personally with no less than twenty parishioners to seek their contribution/five-year pledge. The first person who is asked to make a pledge is the pastor. He is asked to do so by the bishop. When he does, I will respond positively to his request.

If we work together with enthusiasm and generosity, I believe that we have an opportunity to greatly improve our parish church by using the parish portion we raise in the campaign to finance the refurbishing of the nave (aisles, floor and pews). If the campaign goes well, we hope to begin the refurbishing project in January 2023 after the Christmas season. It will require 6-8 weeks to complete. More details describing this project will be forthcoming.

I wish to use the remainder of this column to follow-up the question-and-answer format from LDA that I reproduced in my last column. There it was described that the amount assigned to our parish would be distributed – 65% to the parish and 35% to Diocesan needs.

The assigned amount to our parish is \$480,000. The formula used to determine this amount (and is the same formula used in all the parishes of the Diocese) is as follows:

Reported Offertory of 2019 - 20	\$391,276
Reported Offertory of 2020 – 21	\$421,658
Divided by 2, multiplied by 1.17	\$475,566
Parish Campaign goal rounded up	\$480,000
Parish Share at 100% of Goal (65%)	\$312,000
Diocesan Share including 2022-23	
Diocesan Annual Appeal (35%)	\$168,000

In the future, I will continue to write about the campaign. If you have questions, you can submit them to me through the rectory or placing them in an envelope in the collection basket and I will attempt to answer them.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioner of Saint Mary's Parish.
