From your pastor . . .

With this column, I will continue with the reproduction of Father John A. Hardon's Catechism on the Real Presence. This is a continuation in the catechesis on the Holy Eucharist in preparing our parish for the National Eucharist Revival that is taking place in all dioceses throughout the United States.

7. *What is the basic teaching of the Second Vatican Council on the Eucharist?*

This basic teaching is what the Council of Trent solemnly defined in the sixteenth century.

8. *What are the exact words of the Council of Trent?*

*“At the Last Supper, on the night He was handed over, our Lord instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of the Body and Blood, to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until He would come, and thus entrust to the Church, His beloved spouse, the memorial of His death and resurrection; a sacrament of devotion, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet in which Christ is received, the soul is filled with grace and there is given to us the pledge of future glory.
(Mysterium Fidei 4 – Pope St. Paul VI).*

9. *What are the two fundamental words which identify the teaching of the Second Vatican Council?*

“Sacrifice” and “Sacrament”. The Mass is a re-presentation of the sacrifice of Calvary, and the sacrament is the Holy Communion by which the faithful receive divine grace, the assurance of eternal life, and what the Church calls “the medicine of immortality.” Holy Communion thus ensures us both the grace we need to reach heaven and the promise of resurrection of our body on the last day (MF 5).

10. *What is the hope of Pope Paul VI?*

He hopes that the restoration of the sacred liturgy will foster unity and mutual love among Christians, which are so desperately needed in our day (MF 6).

11. *What is one important means by which the Pope looks forward to the liturgical restoration?*

The Bishop of Rome expects the Catholic leaders to penetrate ever more deeply into the doctrine of the Holy Eucharist with special reference to its relation with the mystery of the Church (MF 7).

12. *Is the Pope confident about this growth in understanding the mystery of the Holy Eucharist?*

He is very confident, since he realizes that the liturgy will be only as authentic and fruitful in grace as it is based on a correct grasp of the meaning of the Holy Eucharist (MF 8).

May you all enjoy this holiday of Memorial Day which remembers the countless sacrifices that were made on behalf of our country by so many selfless and brave women and men. Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
