From your pastor . . .

With today's celebration of the Baptism of Our Lord, we bring to a conclusion the Christmas season. I hope these days have been a blessing for you and your family members and that all of you have been enriched by the graces that come into our lives when we commemorate the mysteries of our Faith, one of the greatest being Christmas.

I wish to use this column to share with you a number of quotes from Pope Francis concerning Christmas. They are very rich in content and your meditating on them will hopefully be a fitting conclusion to this Christmas season.

“Jesus is knocking at your heart; Jesus is telling you the same thing that the angel told the shepherds: a Redeemer has been born to you. He simply asks you to listen – or rather, he asks you to seek him.”

“The sign is the same: *look for him where no one else would*. Don't look for him among the lights of the great cities; don't look for him in appearances. Don't look for him in all that pagan assemblage that is offered to us continually. Seek him in the unusual, in surprising places.”

“To meet Jesus one has to make oneself small. Shed all pretension. Shed every ephemeral illusion; get down to the essential, to what promises you life, to what gives you dignity. Lower yourself: do not be afraid of humility.”

“Lower yourself, take a gamble on meekness, take a gamble on goodness. Look through the foliage of life, and there you will find what no one else understands, a child lying in a manger wrapped in swaddling clothes. There you will find Jesus every day.”

“There's no entry fee to meet Jesus. If you want to, simply enter. He needs your freedom: he needs you to accept the free gift of salvation. There is no other explanation for this mystery of the Nativity but the gratuitousness with which God comes to meet us.”

“Look at her, the Mother – so simple and gentle – and ask her to take you by the hand to seek the child, who cannot be found in pride and vanity but only in the simplicity of all that is love, meekness, and goodness.”

“This is the sign, the password, the signal: a newborn child lying in a manger who calls together all those who are marginalized. And no one can say that he himself is not marginalized.”

“Close to the crib, then, do two things: first, feel yourself invited to the beauty of humility, of meekness, of simplicity; and second, seek within your heart the ways in which you are on the outside, marginalized, and let Jesus call you from your emptiness, your limitations, your egoism. Let yourself be caressed by God, and you will understand better what simplicity, meekness, and unity are.

Our Holy Father gives us some profound matters upon which to meditate.
Remember to pray often for our Holy Father, the Pope.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary Parish.

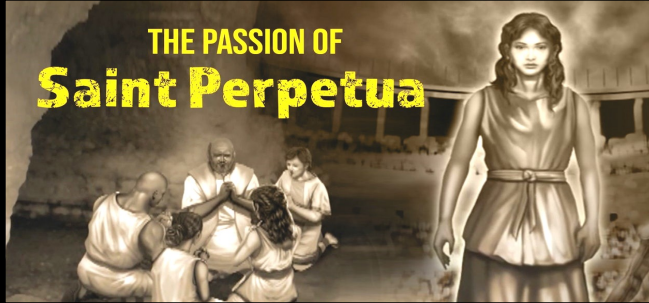
