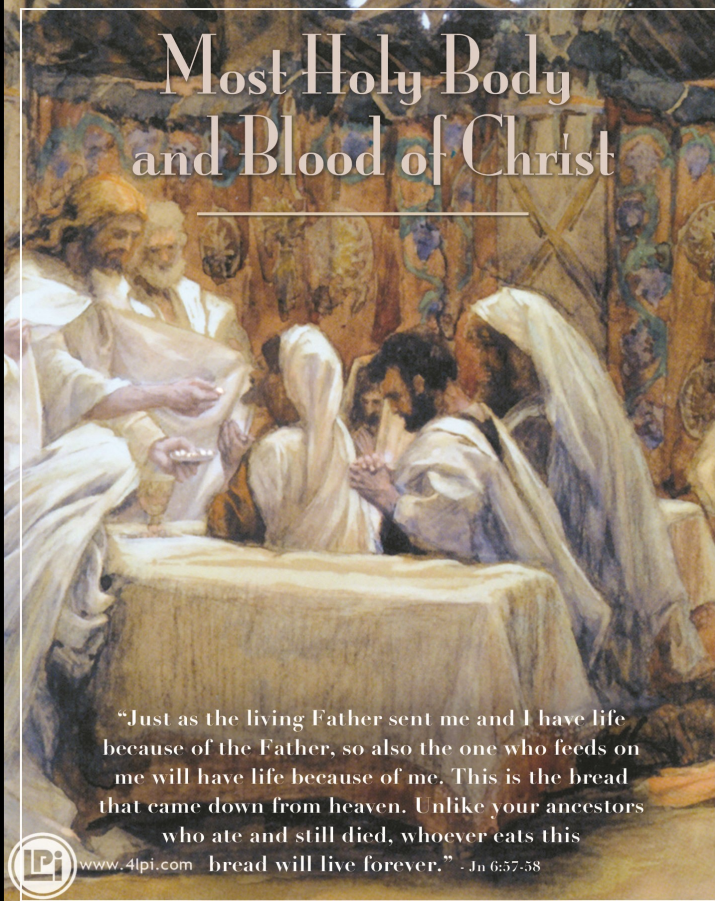

From your pastor . . .

I take this occasion to extend a happy and blessed Fathers' Day to our fathers as well as to commend to God's mercy and love our fathers who have died. Thank you, Fathers, for all that you do on behalf of your families. Sadly, in our present time, the importance of fatherhood is not as appreciated as it should be. Know that the Church understands your importance and she will always respect and cherish your vocation.

I wish to use some of the space in this column to advertise an employment position for the Lydia House Ministries. One of its important ministries is what is known as "A Child and Family Place." It is a temporary homeless shelter located at 929 West Seminary Street in Richland Center. The board of directors, of which I am a member is presently searching for an overseer of families in shelter and the building. It involves five hours per week and compensates at a \$18.00 to \$22.00 range. I have a job description that I can pass on to whoever who may be interested in this position.

In addition to the above position, the Lydia House Ministries Board has an opening for another board member. This would be a volunteer position and would involve supervision of "A Child's and Family Place." If you are interested in servicing in such a position, please contact me at the rectory.

In the weeks and months to come, you will be hearing much about a Diocesan-wide campaign called: "Inspired by the Spirit." It is a capital campaign that will be carried out in every parish in the Diocese of La Crosse. Elsewhere in the bulletin the official logo appears for this campaign.

The campaign will be an opportunity to provide contributions for needed restoration in our church building, most particularly the nave (where the pews and aisles are located). The floor cover in the aisles and under the pews are original to the church building (1954). In some places the tile has become discolored and has been lifting out of place. Thanks to Jim Pulvermacher and Gorilla Glue, they have been reattached to the floor for a temporary fix. However, there is a bigger difficulty that cannot be temporarily fixed; that being that all the tiles were constructed with asbestos. While it does not pose an immediate hazard the more that these tiles lift out of place, that risk increases. This nave flooring needs to be replaced with a floor covering that will provide safety for all, but also a beauty that will complement the beauty of our sanctuary.

In the weeks to come, I will use this column to communicate more about this project, including the anticipated dates for when it will happen. Eventually, there will be a rendering (drawing) of what is being proposed.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioner of Saint Mary's Parish.
