From your pastor . . .

I was recently asked by a parishioner about what appears to be a Catholic Religious Order that has been established in the rural area of Gays Mills. Most prominent is the religious garb worn by a few women who live and work at what is called, Saint Francis Hermitage.

It is advertised as an organic farming enterprise that along with a chapel and gift shop has a restaurant that features French cuisine. The religious name being used by the community established there is *Fraternite Notre Dame*, (Fraternity of Our Lady).

After consulting with the Diocese of La Crosse, I learned that the *Fraternite Notre Dame* is not in union with the Catholic Church and that the “bishop/founder” is not legitimately ordained. This would mean that any attempt to celebrate a ‘sacrament’ by this bishop or by priests ordained by him would be illicit.

Interestingly, one of the first places this group became known is in the Archdiocese of Detroit, Michigan, which as you may know is where our newly installed diocesan bishop, Gerard Battersby served as a priest and bishop before coming to us. I will reproduce below the advisory from the Archdiocese of Detroit.

“The Archdiocese of Detroit Department of Communications invites parishes to publish the following advisory in their bulletins:

Regarding Fraternite Notre Dame

Each of us in the Catholic faith community has a responsibility to reduce error, avoid schism, and promote ecclesiastical communion. To that end, the Archdiocese of Detroit shares the following information about a group operating in Detroit and elsewhere called “Fraternite Notre Dame,” which presents itself as a traditional Catholic religious order of priests, friars, and religious sisters.

Fraternite Notre Dame entered the Archdiocese of Detroit in 2018 without the permission of Archbishop Vigneron. As you may know, valid Catholic religious orders may not enter a diocese without the permission of the local bishop.

The group bought the former Most Holy Name of Jesus church building on Van Dyke Avenue on the eastside of Detroit. Most Holy Name of Jesus Church is no longer a church according to the Church’s law; it was closed in 1990 and deconsecrated, meaning it would no longer serve as a sacred space for Catholic worship. The building was sold to another religious group, which later sold the property to Fraternite Notre Dame.

Fraternite Notre Dame represents itself as being in full communion with the Catholic Church and asserts that it has a Cardinal-liaison assigned to the group by the Vatican. Despite the Archdiocese of Detroit’s multiple requests for confirmation or clarification, the group has not presented anything to support these claims.

In the interest of truth and to avoid confusion among the faithful, we must clarify that, as best we are able to tell, Fraternite Notre Dame is not an organization in ecclesiastical communion with the Catholic Church. Catholics are advised to avoid association with this group.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter. Let us pray that God will bring all Christian communities into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church, so that we may all be one. (cf. John 17:21)”

This notice from the Archdiocese of Detroit puts forth the approach that I believe we should take toward the Saint Francis Hermitage near Gays Mills. If you were to stop and eat at their restaurant, I don’t believe this would create a difficulty. However, participating in any formal prayers and religious services carried out by the *Fraternite Notre Dame* should be avoided.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary’s Parish.
