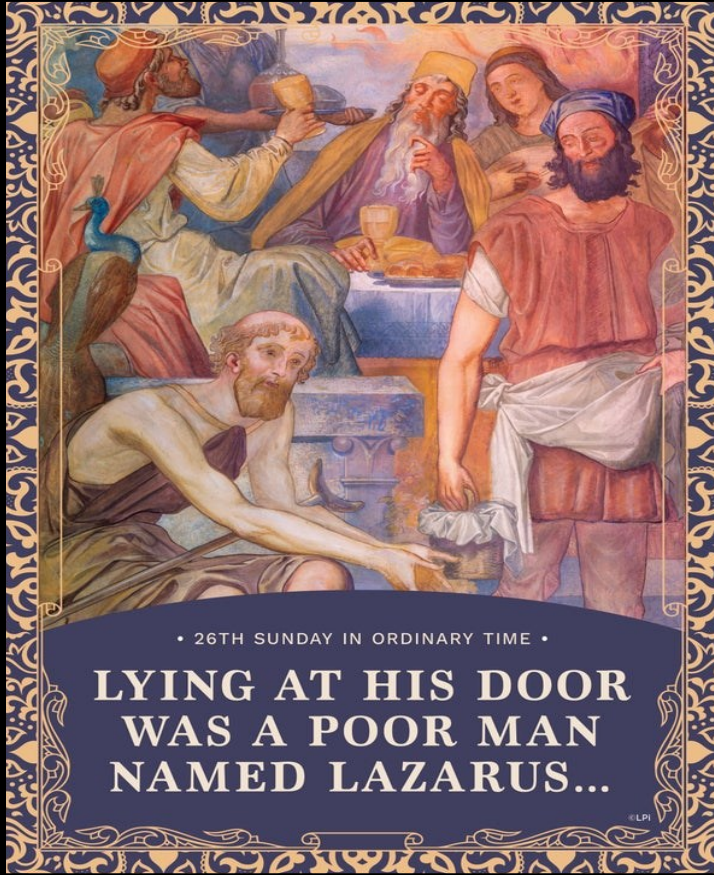

I want to begin this weekend by acknowledging and thanking everyone for their participation and involvement in our Parish Festival. For all those that won one of our raffle drawings, those prizes will be sent out within the next two weeks in the mail. Thank you all!

There were also a few other things that I think deserve mentioning as well. We want to congratulate Kaden Thompson as he entered into the Church this last weekend. It was a privilege to be able to walk with him on his journey into the Church and to be able to administer the Sacraments. Personally, it is something that is a great source of joy for me to witness and participate in the process of someone becoming united to Christ and the Church. It encourages me to continue to grow deeper in my Faith and strive for holiness all the more.

Also last Sunday, we held our first youth group meeting. It was a great evening with an impromptu bags tournament, pizza and wings, learning about the life of St. Joseph of Cupertino, and a friendly, egg drop competition. We are looking forward to many more youth nights and fun events!

Looking ahead, we have a number of events and opportunities. This weekend we have our first Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 8:00 Mass.
