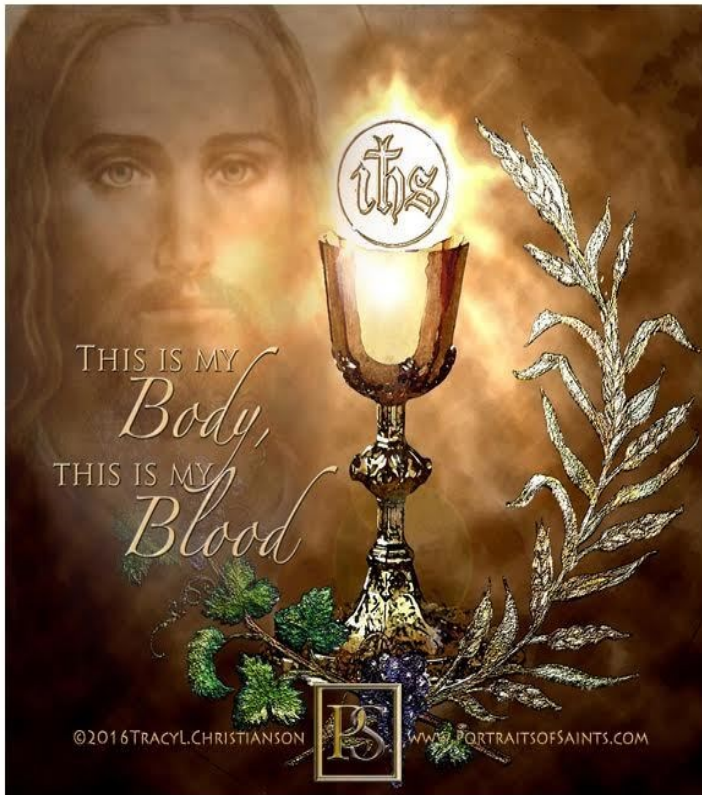

From your pastor . . .

The renderings of the communion rails that will be installed in the future are again being presented in this column.

Each rail is nine feet long. This should allow 5 to 6 people to stand or kneel along each rail at any one time. When it is observed that the priest and deacon have consumed the Holy Eucharist at the altar, those who come first for communion, i.e., the people from the choir followed by those seated in the front of the church should without hesitation take a place along the rail starting on the main aisle and proceeding to the end of the rail (in the direction of the side aisles.) When the rail is filled, those coming forward up the main aisle will stop and wait for a place that will soon open. The priest and deacon (or extra-ordinary minister) will distribute moving in the direction of the main aisle to the side aisles. After distributing to the last communicant at the rail, he will walk the length of the rail back to the main aisle and begin again with those who have filled in the space vacated by the previous communicant.

I again wish to emphasize that standing or kneeling can be chosen. Those who choose to stand should be certain to come up close to the rail.

As is presently done, Holy Communion will be brought directly to those who sit in the very first pews (or wheel-chairs) and are unable to come forward to the rail.

If the above explanation is difficult to imagine, the procedure will be explained when the rails are installed and should be more easily understood when observed first-hand. I believe that eventually, all will proceed smoothly.

Until I write again, may God bless you and all the parishioners of Saint Mary's Parish.
